Embracing the Future: Project 2010

t the May 8 Membership Meeting, the membership overwhelmingly supported a Board directive to begin a capital fundraising campaign for an expansion to the school facility. The members endorsed the directive with 97% approval after architect Roland Jonker delivered a presentation about a proposed expansion and John Meiboom outlined a campaign plan.

Roland Jonker presented preliminary plans addressing the school's needs as identified over the past years by members of the staff, Board, and Association. These needs include new science rooms, space for the popular small engines program, more space for art classes involving different media such as ceramics and printmaking, quiet study spaces for students, and music practice rooms. The total estimated cost of the expansion is \$3,000,000.

Principal Ren Siebenga shared the exciting news that a long-time supporter of the school had pledged a matching gift of up to \$1,000,000 over three years to kickstart the fundraising campaign.

John Meiboom, contracted to lead the campaign after serving as Board Chair, outlined a plan in which the first million dollars would be raised in pledges by the summer and another million in pledges through a more extensive fundraising effort in the fall. The main goal is to have the necessary pledges in place to allow construction to begin in the spring of 2009.

It is an exciting time at TDChristian as we seek to continue to provide students with opportunities and spaces in which they can grow, learn, and thrive. This is another important step in our mission to educate young people for service and citizenship in the light of God's

Saloma Smith, a grandmother nearly 80 years old, reminisced about her family's involvement with TDChristian. She described first hearing about the fledgling school in 1963 from the Edelmans, whose son was a friend of her son David. David was entering Grade 9 that September, and when Saloma learned of the new Christian high school starting up in the basement of a Christian Reformed Church in Rexdale, she was excited.

"Our church had no tradition of Christian schooling, but I was teaching in the public system and had reasons for being interested in a Christian school for my children," said Mrs. Smith.

She described the first parents' night-short, dark-haired David almost hidden by the many tall, blond Dutch students-and how the words spoken there inspired her with confidence that her son would be taught in a Christ-honouring way. Many of the parents were poor then, but they knew their sacrifice would not be in vain. Mrs. Smith also gratefully recalled the willingness of TD staff to give extra time and energy to meet her children's academic needs, offering extracurricular classes in Greek and Latin. Her four children all attended TDChristian, and David even married a fellow student.

Saloma's daughter Debbie then shared her experience as a TD student in the 70s, almost the only one not of Dutch Christian Reformed background, and observed that it taught her adaptability and openness to difference. She appreciated that although TD was not pedagogically advanced in those days, staff managed to pass on a vision and cultivate genuine interchange with students. Debbie also related how, as a parent, she had been encouraged by the compassion and commitment staff had shown her own sons, Caspian and Luke, and how they had benefited from attending TDChristian. Her youngest son Aaron eagerly anticipates coming in September, having heard many choice stories about TD from his brothers. @TDC See "Reflections" continued on page 4

Reflections

The 80's

In the 1980s, TD was a school where clear boundaries separated different subject areas. We somewhat naively hoped that students by themselves would be able to integrate the various parts of their learning, inside school as well as outside it, with their Christian faith into a coherent and complete life. For the most part, teachers were expected to be the experts in a given subject area; their job was to deliver their knowledge to the students. I, for one, did nothing to alter this picture. It was comfortable, safe, and conformed fairly closely to what I thought a good school should look like.

Over the years, TD has become a place where we can afford to experiment with novel teaching ideas, unconventional instructional locations, and different relationships between students and subject matter. It has become a place where exciting and unpredictable things happen. It is a place where students are challenged and trusted with responsibility for their own learning. And it is thriving.

On my first day as a student at TD, I was scared sick, my stomach turned, and I clung to a Grade 8 friend from John Knox Christian School in Brampton. But over time I learned that this place was safe. I learned how to fit in, where to rebel, and how to do school. And somewhere along the line, my faith and education began to meet. I was here from 1990-1995; there were a lot of lectures, notes, and tests, and it was a very typical high school in the academic sense, although perhaps slightly more rigorous than my other school options. My worldview was significantly shaped here. As a student, my teachers knew me; they pushed me, argued, disciplined, and befriended me. I loved this school as a student, and because of that, graduation was bittersweet.

I came back as a teacher in 2002. I see a school that is vibrant, experimental, academic, loving, and more diverse than in the 1990s. I see TDChristian as a school that embraces the "other." The administration pushes us to be different and try new things, but demands quality. I have totally changed my style, opinions, and methods of teaching in the last six years. I attribute that to the freedom and vision of our leadership.



are shaping TDChristian's future






TDChristian's own detailed student enrollment projections had forecast a five percent drop in enrollment starting in 2007/08. Thankfully, it didn't happen.
