Project 20/20 - L. Fernhout

Project 20/20 construction is now 95% complete! You have been an incredible blessing to TDChristian's Project 20/20 by giving your time, money, and prayers. Our campaign has reached \$3.3 million, the most TDChristian has ever raised. Given the construction costs and the pandemic, however, we could end up with a loan of \$4.5 million. The Giving Catalogue has raised over \$90,000 in items which includes a matching gift. Kristina's Wish seat campaign has raised \$20,000, enough to buy 19 seats for the Presentation Centre. Although the construction is near complete, the campaign continues! We humbly present the following things that TDChristian's Project 20/20 still needs. Welcome back! It's great to see many people back in the building.

For students new to TDChristian, and as a reminder to returning students, a few points about Library use at TD Christian:

- You don't need a TDChristian library card to borrow books.
- A book can be borrowed for a 4-week period. You will receive an Edsby message just before it is due. It is possible to ask for a renewal over Edsby.
- If the librarian is unavailable, students can borrow a book by leaving a note listing the full name of the borrower, the book's title, and the last 5 digits of the TDChristian bar code (a sticker on the back of the book).
- Because the library is being used as the Learning Commons, many of the non-fiction titles have been packed up temporarily to make room.
- The fiction section of the library is still fully available. If a student needs a particular book, and can't find it, just ask the librarian.
- The Science Fiction/Fantasy section, a favourite of many students, is available in a different library location.
