Welcome to 2021!

As a staff, over 40 of us met by Zoom on Monday. Our hope and prayer is that even in lockdown, God will provide a positive way forward as we endeavour to end Quad 2 well. To encourage you I share parts of math teacher David Hagen's thoughtful and hopeful devotions, "New Beginnings."

"In early December, as I knew my turn on staff devotions was approaching, I was mulling over the idea of new beginnings. First of all, it is fitting since it is now a New Year.

Well, new beginnings are fantastic. They provide a clean slate, a do over, a way to move on or improve. They allow us to forget and forge something new. We mark the changing in years typically with big celebrations; we live in hope that, "This will be the year!" However, we have many beginnings throughout the year: start of the school year, start of a new semester (or quadmester), start of summer, and, even, the start of a new day.

God is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. When I think about that, I imagine God before creation and after he comes again. And when he does, we will begin a new earth. God is timeless and forever. God is at the "endpoints."

But, what if we add the letter "s" to both words? God is BeginningS and EndS. Each beginning, whether it is the start of a new year, the start of a new course, the beginning of a new life, a new relationship, a new lockdown, a new day, a new hour, or even a new minute, God is there. In a similar way God is at the "ends" – the moments, the days, every part of our lives.

At the start of 2021, I wish to highlight 'beginnings' that come from God's Word.

University and Community College Information

• **University Applications** are due Jan. 15 by midnight. Students should check e-mail regularly for information from the universities to which they applied. They should fill out required supplementary applications well and on time; missing the deadline will result in losing the opportunity to be admitted to the program.

- Community College Applications made by February 1 will receive equal consideration from colleges.
- Students applying outside of Ontario or to Christian Universities or Colleges need to fill out separate applications. Students should notify their guidance counselor if they are applying to a private university or Bible college or if they are applying to colleges or universities outside Ontario.
- Students applying to post-secondary programs that need a portfolio should check the appropriate websites carefully for portfolio deadlines to ensure that they submit their portfolios on time.
- ACT Five: Grade 12 (or recently graduated) students interested in a gap year program for next year should look at Redeemer's gap year program. Four past TDChristian students have attended this exciting program that combines faith development, community, adventure, career mentorship, and university courses. It helps prepare students for what's next and where God may be calling them. Check the program's blog at active.redeemer.ca. For a free application and maximum consideration apply by January 15 at apply.redeemer.ca/apply/. The first 25 students who complete an application receive a free Act Five t-shirt! This program was established through the work of Redeemer University and five Christian high schools including TDChristian, which remains a supporter of this great program.

Skills to Succeed at University (brought to you by Trent University): In a recent Globe and Mail editorial, a professor wrote that university is not a harder version of high school. At university, students are challenged in more ways than assignments and exams. They can also learn a lot from those experiences by practicing a few key skills.

Here are FIVE qualities that help students navigate and overcome common challenges, besides studying hard:

- **1. Time Management**: University students spend less time in class but do more work than in high school. Students need to learn to juggle 20 hours of class time, 15 hours of assignments and reading, and in some cases, a part-time job or extracurriculars.
- **2. Personal Responsibility**: University students are in full control of their education and need to learn to act in their own best interest, an important life skill in decision making.
- **3. Self-direction**: A university education should be the result of students' choices, abilities, and desires. When students set the path of their education, they are more invested and committed to learn.
- **4. Persistence**: Challenges and obstacles are common and can take different forms. Students need to learn to keep trying, learning, and asking questions to find the rewards that come from hard work and dedication.
- **5. Resilience**: University is a place where students shouldn't be afraid of making errors. Focusing on doing their best work and learning from mistakes prepares students to face new challenges and obstacles throughout life.

Summer Options

Explore! Live the Canadian experience! Students in Grades 11 or 12 should consider taking Explore. This five-week intensive immersion program is adapted to all skill levels. It is an opportunity to travel, learn and practise French while discovering a new culture. The \$2,800 bursary (available to all applicants) pays for most of the cost. Students can also apply to **Languages at Work**, which provides opportunities to work in your host community following the **Explore** program. Youth Explore is a three week intensive immersion program for youth aged 13 to 15. The \$2,000 bursary pays for most of the cost. Students work at improving thier French, meeting new people, and exploring Canada! More information can be found at myexplore.ca.
