

SHINING A BRIGHTER LIGHT

from the Project 20/20 Campaign Team

Rev. John Strachan, first Anglican bishop of Toronto, is remembered for his monumental contribution to education in Canada, helping to found McGill University, heading up the University of Toronto, and organizing Ontario's Protestant public schools. In 1867 he wrote, "You cannot divorce religion from education; schools will inevitably reflect the philosophical and religious (or irreligious) biases of those who direct them."

Research by Statistics Canada reveals that those educated in our post-Christian school system represent the largest percentage of non-believers in any age group. In this secular educational environment, schools like TDChristian play an increasingly important role. According to national think tank Cardus' 2018 report, Walking the Path: The Religious Lives of Young Adults in North America, Christian school graduates adhere more strongly to historic Christian belief, are much more likely to practise Christian spiritual disciplines, and are less likely to turn from the faith of their childhood.



This is good news!

It affirms the importance of Christian schools in helping our students on their journeys of faith and learning.

At TDChristian, we want to do this well. Everything we do belongs to God and is for his glory. We are honour-bound to provide our students with rigorous,

The summit was an excellent opportunity for youth from across Canada to learn about the often unmentioned Christian presence on Parliament Hill. We discovered that roughly 10% of MPs in the House of Commons are Christian; this is in addition to the countless other Christian staff, who all play a part in running our country. In fact, Christians working on Parliament Hill quietly get together every week to pray and support one another.

Leaving the conference, I felt confident in God's presence in the government as well as in our lives.

The conference verse this year was Esther 4:14: "For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

Mordecai says this to Esther when she is scared to go and confront her husband, King Xerxes. A genocide of the Jews has been planned, and Mordecai knows that she is the one who can stop it. Esther, however, knows that she could be punished severely or even killed for speaking out if the King doesn't like what she says to him. In order to save her people, she needs to trust that God has put her where she is for a reason, and that he will be with her.

The idea of being put somewhere "for such a time as this" is still very relevant today. As can be seen in conversations with MPs, standing up for your beliefs in a public place such as the House of Commons isn't always easy, especially when your beliefs can cause people to make harsh judgments about you.

But these MPs won't just give up on their beliefs because they go against mainstream society. They know that while they are not the only ones who can do God's work, they have been placed by him in this position at this time for a purpose. They humble themselves before God, trust him, and are willing to serve.

This applies in our own lives as well. God has placed us all where we are for a reason. It is up to us to listen to him and abandon our hesitations, even in hard situations. We need to humble ourselves before God and see how we are meant to serve him in each and every situation we are placed in.

Sometimes standing up for our beliefs and serving can be difficult or scary. In some situations, we may feel that we don't have what it takes to serve God, that we aren't worthy or ready. We never need to worry, though. We just need to trust God, because he will give us everything we need to serve him well. As one of the speakers at the conference said, "God doesn't call the equipped; he equips the called."






































